"SECONDS OF SUNSHINE"

Every Sunday, during the morning worship service, the Pastor devotes five minutes ("Seconds of Sunshine") to the little babies, who have been born in the community during the past week. He reads the names of the babies and their parents, and reminds the people that this is the baby's first Lord's Day upon the earth, and that the coming of this little new life and soul is a sacred trust and delicate responsibility, which God has placed upon both the parents and the church. He emphasizes the interest of God in the little child by quoting such scriptures as: "Suffer the little children to come unto me"; "Take this child and train him for me". Then the pastor and church join in a prayer, dedicating the child to God and invoking His blessings upon him, that he might grow in "wisdom and statue and in favor with God and man", praying that both parents and church will so live and proclaim Christ that these little ones, in the tender years of their lives, will come to know Christ as their Savior.

The Church has nobly provided four beautiful, comfortable and adequate nurseries for these little children, which are supervised by gentle, understanding and capable workers, during both the Sunday School hour and the Preaching services, making it possible for the parents of these little ones to attend the church services.

HISTORICAL SKETCH OF THE CHURCH

The First Baptist Church of Cordele, Georgia, was organized April 14, 1889. According to previous appointment, Dr. C. M. Irwin, Dr. A. B. Campbell and the Rev. W. H. Norton met in what was known as the "Academy" for this purpose. There were twenty-three charter members. J. H. Stapleton, S. W. Taylor and W. C. Williford were recognized as Deacons, having served as such elsewhere. Joseph E. Bivins was elected as first Clerk. On September 29, 1889, Dr. C. M. Irwin was called to the pastorate, bu-

On September 29, 1889, Dr. C. M. Irwin was called to the pastorate, but declined to accept. The Rev. R. B. Taylor was called to the pastorate October 6, 1889 and served until October 4, 1890. He was succeeded by the Rev. B. W. Davis, who served until October 1, 1893. In succession other pastors to serve the church are as follows: The Reverends: J. M. Kelly, R. O. Sessoms, E. Culpepper, J. C. Brewton, J. D. Winchester, A. B. Campbell,

f. W Cramer, J. H. Coin, Wallace Wear, Pope, A. Duncan, T. Andrew Caraker, J. L. Drake, T. Andrew Caraker, C. M. Coalson, and the present pas'or, Clifton E. Fite, was called October 13, 1946.

The church was admitted into the Houston Baptist Association October 12, 1889. At this time the membership numbered thirty-four. In 1893, when the Cordele Church first entertaind the Houston Association, the membership had grown to one hundred and forty-five. With a few variations, the membership has steadily increased until, according to the last statistical report, it now numbers one thousand and thirty-three members.

The first house of worship was a modest frame building, valued at two thousand dollars. The present commodious and beautiful building was erected in 1914, during the pastorate of the Rev. J. H. Coin. This building was erected at a total cost of \$32,755.26.

D. B. Register was the first Sunday School Superintendent, and the first reported enrollment was twenty-five pupils. The present enrollment is 707. Other superintendents who served, some of them for long terms, are: D. T. Dough'ry, W. M. Wilson, G. A. Ballenger, J. W. Bivins, T. J Durrett, R. E. Harris, Guy T. Lunsford, E. T. Shingler, F. B. Callaway, Guy T. Cobb, R. W. Williams, Wendel Horne, and C. A. Middlebrooks is the present superintendent. George Dexter Bolin has served as Secretary and Treasurer for many years.

Mrs. R. M. Brown was among the first organists to serve the church, followed by Miss Essie Harris, who, as Mrs. G. A. Ballenger and Mrs. J. D. Cobb, has continued to serve consecutively up to the present time, with the exception of the time served by her daughter, Mrs. James L. Bryan. C. M. McKenzie served as usher for nearly forty years. The late Miss Tallulah Atkins served as Clerk and Treasurer for a number of years, and she was succeeded by Miss Edith Kate Roberts, who is serving in this capacity at the present time.

The Womans' work was organized in the early history of the church, and has always been a strong factor in its activities and accomplishments.

On the pages of its records may be found the names of Mrs. W. C. Williford, Mrs. R. M. Brown, Mrs. D. T. Doughtry, Mrs. J. K. Smith, Mrs George L. Scandrett, Mrs. J. B. Ryals, Mrs. U. V. Whipple, Mrs. C. T Fox, Mrs E L Kiker, Mrs. J. M. Diffee, Mrs. W. H. Thornton, Jr., Mrs. D. J Williams, Mrs J. P. Culler and others. The present President is Mrs. C. G. Gannon, who has served for the past eight years.



CHURCH COVENANT:

Having been led as we believe, by the Spirit of God to receive the Lord Jesus Christ as our Saviour and on profession of our faith, having been baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, we do now in the presence of God, angels, and this assembly, most solemnly and joyfully enter into covenant with one another, as one body in Christ.

We engage, therefore, by the aid of the Holy Spirit to walk together in Christian love; to strive for the advancement of this Church in knowledge, holiness and comfort to promote its prosperity and spirituality; to sustain its worship, ordinances, discipline and doctrines; to contribute cheerfully and regularly to the support of the ministry, the expenses of the Church, and the relief of the poor, and the spread of the Gospel through all nations. We also engage to maintain family and secret devotions; to religiously educate our children; to seek the salvation of our kindred and acquaintances; to walk circumspectly in the world; to be just in our dealings, faithful in our engagements, and exemplary in our deportment; to avoid all tattling, backbitings, and excessive anger; to obstain from the sale and use of intoxicating drinks as a beverage, and to be zealous in our efforts to advance the kingdom of our Saviour.

We further engage to watch over one another in brotherly love; to remember each other in prayer; to aid each other in sickness and distress; to cultivate Christian sympathy in feeling and courtesy of speech; to be slow to take offense, but always ready for reconcilation, and mindful of the rules of our Saviour to secure it without delay.



DECLARATION OF FAITH

I. Of the Scriptures.

We believe that the Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired, and is a perfect treasure of heavenly instruction; that it has God for its author, salvation for its end, and truth without any mixture of error, for its matter; that it reveals the principles by which God will judge us; and therefore is, and shall remain to the end of the world, the true center of Christian union, and the supreme standard by which all human conduct, creeds and opinions should be tried.

II. OF THE TRUE GOD

We believe that there is one, and only one living and true God, an infinite intell'gent Spirit whose name is JEHOVAH, the Maker and Supreme Ruler of heaven and earth; ineppressibly glorious in holiness, and worthy of all possible honor, confidence and love; that in the unity of the Godhead there are three persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost; equal in every divine perfection, and executing distinct but harmonious offices in the great work of

III. OF THE FALL OF MAN

We believe that man was created in holiness, under the law of his Maker; but by voluntary transgression fell from that holy and happy state; in consequence of which all mankind are now sinners, not by constraint, but choice being by nature utterly void of that holiness required by the law of God, positively inclined to evil; and therefore under just condemnation to eternal ruin, without defense or excuse.

IV. OF THE WAY OF SALVATION

We believe that the salvation of sinners is wholly of grace; through the mediatorial offices of the Son of God, who by the appointment of the Father, freely took upon him our nature, yet without sin; honored the divine law by his personel obedience, and by his death made a full atonement for our sins; that having risen from the dead he is now enthroned in heaven; and uniting in his wonderful person the tenderest sympathy with divine perfections, he is every way qualified to be a suitable, a compassionate, and an all-sufficient Saviour.

V. OF JUSTIFICATION

We believe that the great gospel blessings which Christ secures to such as helieve in him is justification; that justification includes the pardon of sin and the promise of eternal life on principles of Righteousness; that it is bestowed not in consideration of any works of righteousness which we have done, but sole through faith in the Redeemer's blood; by virture of which faith his perfect righteousness is freely imputed to us of God; that it brings us into a state of most blessed peace and favor with God, and secures every other blessing needful for time and etern'ty.

VI. OF THE FREENESS OF SALVATION

We believe that the blessings of salvation are made free to all by the gospel; that it is the immediate duty of all to accept them by a cordial penitient and obedient faith; and that nothing prevents the salvation of the greatest sinner on earth but his own inherent depravity and voluntary rejection of the gospel; which rejection involves him in an aggravated condemnation.

VII. OF GRACE IN REGENERATION

We believe that, in order to be saved, sinners must be regenerated or born again; that regeneration consists in giving a holy disposition to the mind; that it is effected in a manner above our comprehension, by the power of the Holy Spirit in connection with divine truth, so as to secure our voluntary obedience to the gospel; and that its proper evidence appears in the holy fruits of repentance and faith and newness of life.

VIII. OF REPENTANCE AND FAITH

We believe that Repentance and Faith are sacred duties, and also inseparable graces, wrought in our souls by the regenerating Spirit of God; whereby, being deeply convinced of our guilt, danger, and helpness, and of the way of salvation by Christ, we turn to God with unfeigned contrition, confession, and supplication for mercy; at the same time heartily receiving the Lord Jesus Christ as our Prophet, Priest and King and relying on him alone as the only and all sufficient Savjour.

IX. OF GOD'S PURPOSE OF GRACE

We believe that Election is the eternal purpose of God, according to which he graciously regenerates, sanctifies and saves sinners; that being perfectly consistent with the free agency of man, it comprehends all the means in connection with the end; that it is a most glorous display of God's sovereign goodness, being infinitely free, wise, holy, and unchangeable; that it utterly excludes boasting, and promotes humility, love, prayer, praise, trust in God and active imitation of his free mercy; that it encourages the use of means in the highest degree; that it may be ascertained by its effects in all who truly believe the gospel; Thus it is the foundation of Christain assurance; and that to ascertain it with regard to ourselves demands and deserves the utmost diligence.

X. OF SANCTIFICATION

We believe that Sanctification is the process by which, according to the will of God, we are made partakers of his holiness that it is a progressive work that it is begun in regenerations; and that it is carried on in the hearts of believers by the presence and power of the Holy Spirit, the Healer and Comforter, in the continual use of the appointed means, especially the word of God, self-examination, self-denial, watchfulness, and prayer.

XI. OF THE PRESERVANCE OF SAINTS

We believe that such only are real believers as endure unto the end; that their perserving attachment to Christ is the grand mark which distinguishes them from superficial professors; that a special Providence watches over their welfare; and that they are kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation.

XII. OF THE HARMONY OF THE LAW AND THE GOSPEL

We believe that the Law of God is the eternal and unchangeable rule of his moral government; that it is holy, just, and good; and that the inability which the Scriptures ascribe to fallen men to fulfill its precepts arises entirely from their love of sin; to deliver them from which, and to restore them through a Mediator to unfeigned obediance to the holy Law, is one great end of the gospel, and of the means of grace connected with the establishment of the visible church.

XIII. OF A GOSPEL CHURCH

We believe that a visible church of Christ is a congregation of baptized believers, associated by covenant in the faith and fellowship of the gospel; observing the ordinances of Christ; governed by his laws; and exercising the gifts, rights, and privileges invested in them by his word; that its only scriptural offices are Bishops, or Pastors, and Deacons, whose qualifications, claims, and duties are defined in the epistles to Timothy and Titus.

XIV. OF BAPTISM AND THE LORD'S SUPPER

We believe that Christian Baptism is the immersion in water of a believer, into the name of the Father, and Son and Holy Ghost; to show forth, in a solemn and beautiful emblem, our faith in the crucified, buried, and risen Saviour with its effect in our death to sin and resurrection to new life; that it is prerequisit to the privileges of a church relation; and to the Lord's Supper; in which the members of the church, by the sacred use of bread and wine are to commensate together the dying love of Christ; preceded always by solemn self-examination.

XV. OF THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH

We believe that the first day of the week is the Lord's Day, or Christ'an Sabbath; and is to be kept sacred to religious purposes, by abstaining from all secular labor and sinful recreations; by the devout observance of all the means of grace, both private and public; and by preparation for that rert that remaineth for the people of God.

XVI. OF CIVIL GOVERNMENT

We believe that civil government is of divine appointment, for the interests and good order of human society; and that magistrates are to be prayed for conscientiously honored, obeyed; except only in things opposed to the will of our Lord Jesus Christ, who is the only Lord of the conscience, and the Prince of the kings of the earth.

XVII. OF THE RIGHTEOUS AND WICKED

We believe that there is a radical and essential difference between the righteous and the wicked; that such only as through faith are justified in the name of the Lord Jesus, and sanctified by the Spirit of our God, are truly righteous in his esteem; while all such as continue in impenitence and unbelief are in his sight wicked, and under the curse; and this distinction holds among men both in and after death.

XVIII. OF THE WORLD TO COME

We believe that the end of the world is approaching; that at the last day Christ will descend from heaven, and raise the dead from the grave to final retribution; that a solemn separation will then take place; that the wicked will be adjudged to endless punishment, and the rightcous to endless joy; and that this judgement will fix forever the final state of men in heaven or hell, of principles of righteousness.


